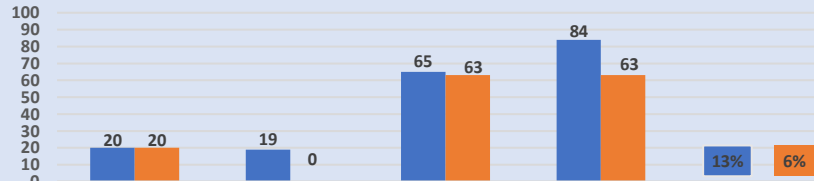


Pride Community Health Organization Key Facts About the Delivery of SRH and HIV Services at Community Level

Project Baseline for Number of targeted pregnant women aged 20-24 testing HIV positive: **20: This means the number of pregnant women testing HIV positive should not exceed 20 throughout the implementation period**

Objective 1: To increase the number of HIV positive pregnant women attending ANC with their partners from 45% to 65% by 2022

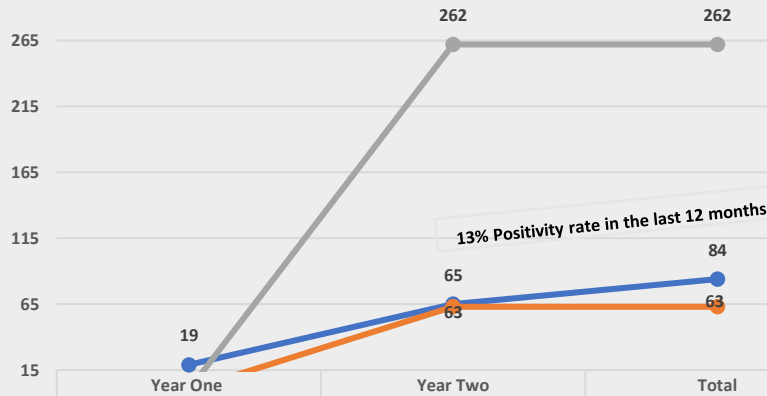

Project Description

Introduction: Pride Community Health Organization is implementing an HIV project in one of Kafue district's densely populated slums whose specific focus aims at supporting affected young mothers through the promotion of good cultural norms, women's access to education, nutrition, and protection that will deliver improvements in social, educational, and health outcomes.

Location of Project: Zambia Compound in Matanda ward, Kafue District.

Duration: 36 months (14-01-2020 through 13-01-2023)

Population of ward: 27,544

Health Facility Catchment Coverage: 12,918

Baseline Details: Between 2018 and 2019, before our intervention, Railway Clinic in Zambia Compound recorded 524 pregnant adolescent girls and young women, and of these 216 girls tested HIV positive, representing 41% Positivity rate and these were able to attend the first ANC, and were also enrolled on ART.

Key Observations



Among the targeted pregnant women aged 20 – 24 years, a total of 664 tested for HIV over the two (2) year period.

In Year (1) one, a total of 19 tested HIV positive, and in Year (2) two, a total 65 tested HIV positive representing 13% Positivity Rate.



Among the targeted non-pregnant women aged 20 – 24 years, a total of 997 tested over the two (2) year period.

In Year (1) one, there was no positive results among non-pregnant women and in Year (2) two, a total of 63 tested HIV positive representing 6% Positivity Rate.



HIV incidence among young women in this densely populated slum is on the increase.

Sexually Transmitted Infections are also on the increase in this densely populated slum.



This may be attributed to the impact of Covid-19 in terms of social restrictions, and stock outs of modern contraception at designated service points.
